School uniform and PE kits

Every child must wear their school uniform every day. Some children may have alternative school uniform arrangements which have been discussed and approved by the school’s leadership team. Every other child is expected to wear their uniform as usual.

PE kits must be worn to school on designated PE days (this does not apply to swimming or after school clubs). Every child is expected to wear the school PE kit, as listed below. Reception class will wear their school uniform every day and change into their PE kit in school, therefore PE kits must be kept at school.

The parents of children who do not wear the appropriate school uniform or PE kit will be contacted by a member of staff.

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There is no required uniform for Nursery. Suitable clothing for indoor and outdoor learning to be worn at all times. They may choose to wear the Reception uniform if they wish.

Attendance

We cannot stress enough the importance of children attending school regularly. A recent Department for Education study found that *'At KS2, pupils not meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths had an overall absence rate of 4.7%, compared to 3.5% among those meeting the expected standard'*. We believe that attendance is the essential foundation to positive outcomes for all pupils.

It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives an education. As parents who have decided to have your child registered at a school, therefore, you have an additional legal duty to ensure your child attends our school regularly.

This year, we have set a whole school target of 96% attendance throughout the course of the academic year. With this in mind, we will not be authorising any holidays during term time and any child whose attendance falls below 90% will be contacted by myself and the Office Manager.

Home and School Partnership

We feel that your child will be most successful, make the most amount of progress and feel happy when school and home work together effectively. This partnership is important to us, so please speak to your child's class teacher if you have any questions or concerns.

Each year we ask for each class to nominate two parent reps to meet with me half termly to discuss current topics that are relevant to the school's ongoing development. Please organise which parents you would like to represent your child's class and email me if you have been selected.

Parents are invited into school to share their child's reading/maths learning. Siblings are welcome but must remain with you at all times and not be allowed to explore the classroom or outside areas. Please find the times and dates below:

- 29th September – Reading Morning (9am-9.30am)
- 16th October – Maths Afternoon (2.30pm-3pm)
- 6th November – Reading Afternoon (2.30pm-3pm)
- 24th November – Maths Morning (9am-9.30am)

As a polite notice, please remember that we do not tolerate any forms of aggression from parents or adults on the school premises towards members of staff or other parents. Anyone presenting in a way that is deemed to be rude or abusive will not be tolerated and will be asked to leave the school premises immediately.
